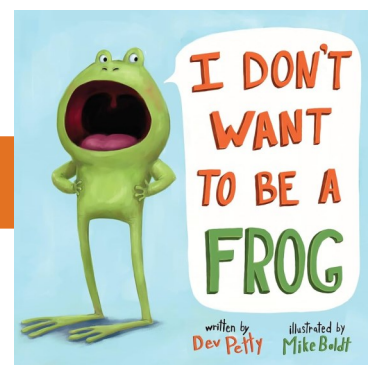
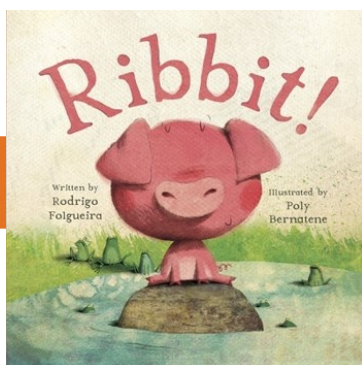


TAKE-HOME FUN!
