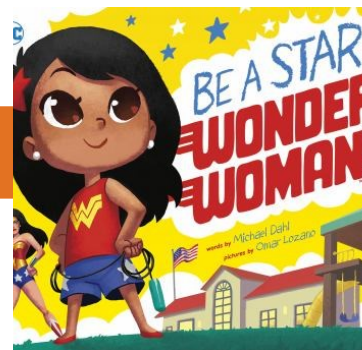


TAKE-HOME FUN!

PLAY
